# KISAKYE EDUCATIONAL INITIATIVE FOR GIRLS (KEIG)

## 1. Introduction

On Saturday, 18th October 2025, Kisakye Educational Initiative for Girls (KEIG) held a special community outreach aimed at supporting and encouraging teenage mothers, vulnerable girls, and their children. The day was made more memorable by the presence of visitors from Germany—Sabine, Marina, Henriette, Kessi, Sergi, Julia, and Claudia—who joined the KEIG team in prayer, fellowship, and celebration.

The outreach was designed to provide spiritual nourishment, psycho social support, and community bonding, while also showcasing the creativity and resilience of young mothers supported by KEIG. The event reflected KEIG's holistic approach to empowerment—addressing both the emotional and practical needs of young mothers.

## 2. Objectives of the Outreach

- To offer spiritual and emotional encouragement to young mothers and their children.
- To strengthen fellowship and peer support among participants.
- To provide individual counseling and guidance to teenage mothers.
- To celebrate milestones and moments of joy within the KEIG community.
- To exhibit and promote products made by young mothers through KEIG's empowerment programs.
- To extend acts of love and generosity, including distribution of shoes to children.

## 3. Sequence of Events

- **Praise and Worship:**



The day began with a lively praise and worship session, led by Rogers and joined by the visiting team from Germany. Joyful songs, clapping, and dancing set a warm and uplifting atmosphere that unified everyone in celebration and gratitude.

- **Opening Prayers:**

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The praise and worship were followed by opening prayers, where both KEIG members and visitors prayed for the mothers, children, and the entire community. The guests from Germany—Sabine, Marina, Henriette, Kessi, Sergi, Julia, and Claudia—led heartfelt prayers of blessing, expressing compassion and solidarity with the gathered families.

- **Individual Counseling Sessions and Fellowship:**



After prayers, individual counseling sessions were conducted by trained KEIG counselors. Mothers were offered private spaces to share their personal challenges, receive guidance, and find emotional support. These sessions helped address issues such as self-esteem, parenting stress, and coping mechanisms. The visitors from Germany

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also shared inspiring words and interacted warmly with participants. Those who gathered for fellowship shared testimonies, songs, and words of encouragement. The fellowship session emphasized community unity, faith, and mutual support.

- **Mother-to-Mother (Peer) Talks:**



A special Mother-to-Mother Talk session provided an opportunity for older or more experienced mothers to share practical parenting advice and emotional encouragement. These peer discussions helped foster sisterhood, resilience, and shared learning.

- **Meals Served:**



Meals were served to the mothers and their children and everyone shared in a hearty meal, creating an atmosphere of joy, laughter, and belonging. The shared meal symbolized unity and mutual care within the KEIG community.

- **Celebrating Ms. Clare Nabirye's Birthday:**

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A joyful moment came when participants gathered to celebrate the birthday of Clare Nabirye, the founder and Executive Director of KEIG. The visitors from Germany gifted a beautiful cake, which was shared among all attendees. The singing, smiles, and celebration brought great delight to both the children and mothers.

- **Giving Out Shoes to Children:**



As an act of kindness, shoes were distributed to several children where by the shoes were donated and distributed by one of the visitors (Claudia). This gesture brought visible excitement and gratitude, especially among children from vulnerable households.

- **Exhibition of Products by Young Mothers and women:**

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The outreach concluded with an exhibition of handmade and sewing machine made products crafted by young mothers trained under KEIG's livelihood programs. Items displayed included clothes, aprons, and other hand-sewn products, showcasing creativity, skill, and empowerment. The visitors took keen interest in the exhibits and commended the mothers for their craftsmanship.

#### 4. Outcomes and Observations

- The outreach attracted over 100 participants, including mothers, children, and community members.
- Participants received spiritual, emotional, and social support, which strengthened their confidence and sense of belonging.
- The presence of international visitors reinforced KEIG's partnerships and inspired both staff and beneficiaries.
- The exhibition highlighted the potential of young mothers to contribute economically when supported with skills training.
- The birthday celebration and shoe distribution added joy and dignity to the event.

#### 5. Challenges and Lessons Learned

- Limited resources constrained the number of children who could receive shoes.
- Counseling demand exceeded available time, indicating the need for extended sessions in future outreaches.
- Collaboration with visiting partners enhanced the event's diversity, learning, and encouragement.
- Visitors gave direct monetary gifts to individuals which created divisions among beneficiaries and bred a sense of unfair treatment since they could not share equally and it's also against KEIG's policy.

#### 6. Conclusion and Recommendations

The outreach successfully achieved its objectives of spiritual nourishment, emotional support, empowerment, and celebration. The event strengthened community bonds and highlighted the importance of partnerships in empowering young mothers.

KEIG recommends:

- Strengthening follow-up visits and psycho social support sessions.
- Expanding livelihood skills programs to reach more young mothers.
- As per KEIG's policy, future visitors should avoid giving direct monetary gifts to individuals and all donations should be channeled through the organization to ensure fairness, unity, and sustainable impact for all beneficiaries.
- Mobilizing additional partners and sponsors to sustain outreach initiatives.
